SAMARTHANAM SPECTACULARS

Samarthanam Trust for the Disabled, in partnership with Hyundai Motor India Foundation, organized the Samarth Assistive Devices Conclave on June 21st. The event promoted inclusivity and investment in assistive devices, distributing 72 devices to people with disabilities and pledging 684 more over the next three years. Academic Highlights

SSLC Results Announcement: SSLC results were announced on May 9th, with a 100% pass rate for the 24 students who attended the exam. Top scorers included Sneha Agsar, Suryanarayana, Abhishek, and Bhagyashri achieving scores above 80%.

Hyundai and Samarthanam Conclave: Hyundai and Samarthanam Trust for the disabled organized a conclave on May 23rd, where three high school teachers volunteered at Conrad Hotel.

INTELLECTUALLY DISABLED (ID) SCHOOLS

MYSURU

A survey for the academic year 2024-25 took place, followed by the reopening of the school.

To mark the commencement of the new academic year, a school initiation program was organized at Samarthanam ID School, where banners, buntings, and attractive notice boards welcomed the children, who were greeted with rose flowers.

The 6th Annual Vanamohotsava of Samarthanam- Mysore was celebrated on World Environment Day.



BELAGAVI

A door-to-door mobilization survey was conducted, leading to the admission of 3 new students; the school reopened on May 29, 2024, with a total student strength of 35 and 3 special education teachers.



BENGALURU

Surveys were conducted in nearby localities: Teachers visited government schools, anganwadis, and homes to spread awareness about Samarthanam's school facilities.

A total of 12 new admissions were completed, enrolling 8 boys and 4 girls.

Two teachers attended a 3-day CRE program held in Davanagere.

Vocational Unit:

On May 31, 2024, students received training in slipper-making skills.



Volunteering Program:

- * A 95.62% pass rate, with 153 out of 160 students passing was achieved.

- * Ms. Nidhi Jadhav excelled with 82.33% in Higher Secondary Science at Shankar Narayan College, Mumbai, featured in Nava Bharath newspaper on May 22, 2024.

- * 200 disabled girls were mobilized for Lowes Projects.

Research Support:

- * An overseas student at University of Montreal was assisted with research on orientation strategies for visually impaired individuals in Asia.
- * Visually impaired students were identified and supported throughout the survey process by coordinators.
- 10 Higher education students from Mumbai visited AMS Software solutions on June 5th.
- * HEP students explored Bandipur Forest with sightings of elephants, deer, and peacocks; visited Pykara waterfalls, shooting point, Tea Factory, and Chocolate Factory in Ooty; and explored Botanical Garden, Pine Forest, and Tea Estates, enjoying local chocolates and tea as part of an educational tour.



MINI SCIENCE LABS

Mini science labs were installed in 51 government schools across India with donations from Otis Elevators, Herbalife, FIS Solutions, TE Connectivity, and OSRAM.

Capacity building programs were conducted for coordinators in schools in Mumbai, Delhi, Kolkata, Hyderabad, Pune, and Bangalore.

Teacher training is underway, completed in 8 schools in Pune and 2 schools in Bangalore.

Monitoring of the science labs is underway in Bangalore schools.

All science labs are expected to be completed by July.

DIGITIZATION OF GOVERNMENT SCHOOLS

- The digitization process of government schools was initiated by Samarthanam Trust with support from FIS Solutions and LIC HFL.
- Funds were utilised to complete the process in 20 government schools in Pune.
- Installation of digital smartboards was completed in 16 schools in Pune, with training for their use underway.
- Capacity building programs for trainers and coordinators were conducted at the Bangalore Samarthanam head office.
- Installation of digital smartboards was completed in 10 schools in April, with training progressing in June.
- LIC HFL donated funds to install solar-powered digital classrooms in 40 government schools in Gadag in April and May.
- Installation of solar panels and smart TVs was completed in the first week of June.

WASH

- Oracle collaborated with Samarthanam for the WASH project, focusing on renovating toilets and installing R.O. water facilities.
- Schools were identified in Raichur, Yadgiri, Virudhunagar, Ramananthapuram, Jalgaon, and Nandurbar for the project.
- Awareness programs on sanitation and hygiene practices were conducted.
- Officials from the Education Department were contacted to ensure project success.
- Need analysis commenced in the targeted areas.

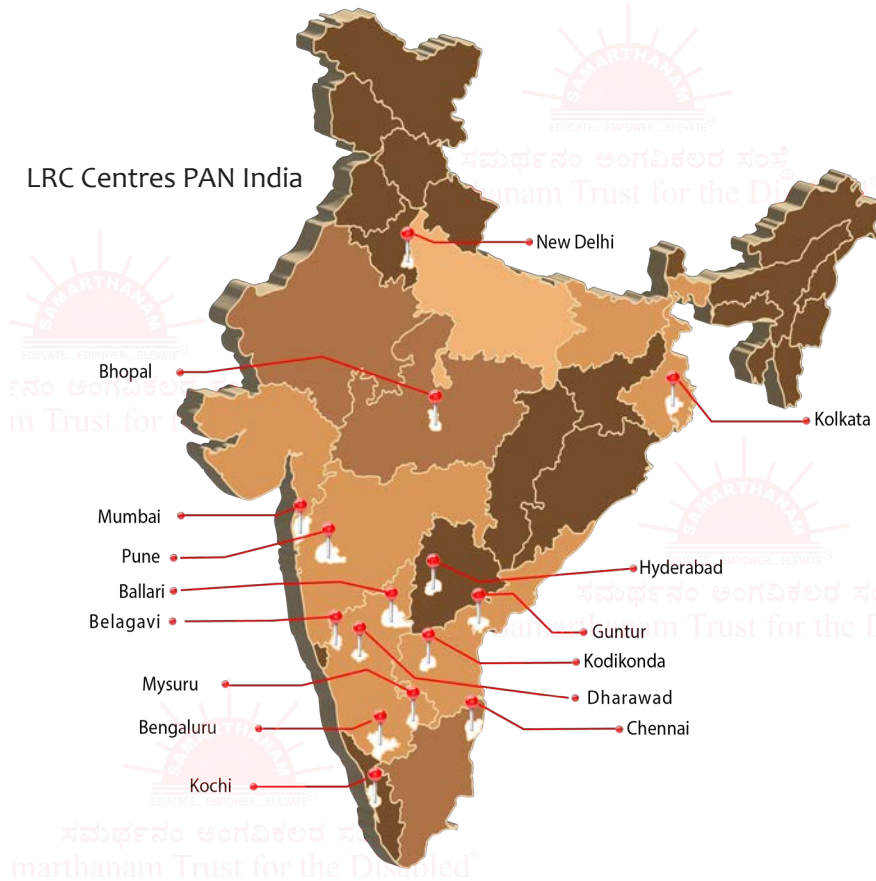

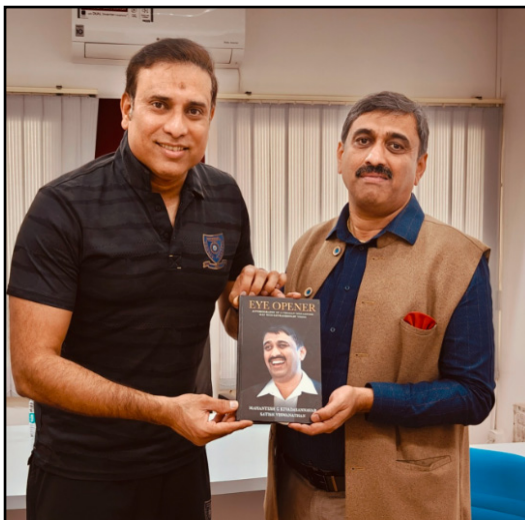

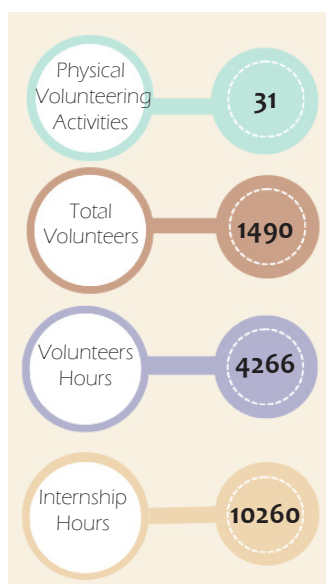

University of Montreal Research Project

Samarthanam is partnering with the University of Montreal, which is conducting research on “The Road to Independent Navigation: An International Survey on Orientation Skills of Individuals Living with Visual Impairments.” This study aims to explore the orientation techniques used by visually impaired individuals worldwide and their impact on independent travel. The project is led by Mr. Joe Nemargut, Assistant Professor at the Université de Montréal's School of Optometry, Maxime Bleau, a doctoral candidate, and Kopila Kafle, M.Sc. candidate in Vision Science, with collaboration from Natalina Martiniello, a course instructor at the Université de Montréal.

Triumph Over Adversity : Manju's Story



Manju, a 37-year-old from Mardi, Ramanagara, faced a life-changing challenge at the age of 4 when polio left him unable to walk. Despite being wheelchair-bound, Manju's determination never wavered. He completed his schooling in Mysore, excelled in his SSLC exams, and trained as a General Mechanic at the Industrial Training Institute. Over seven years, he worked with multiple companies, driven by his passion and the need to support his aging parents.

Manju faced discrimination and hesitation from others, which motivated him to return to Ramanagara to assist his father in their family business. Together, they ran a small shop selling milk and newspapers. Tragedy struck when his father and sister passed away, leaving Manju solely responsible for the family. His disability made it difficult to restock the shop and deliver supplies, causing his business to decline and pushing him into financial hardship and depression.

A ray of hope appeared when a doctor recommended an electric tricycle, but the cost was beyond his reach. In desperation, Manju approached Samarthanam Trust for the Disabled. With support from HMD Global, he received the electric tricycle, transforming his life. He could now independently manage his shop and deliveries, reviving his business and restoring his financial stability.

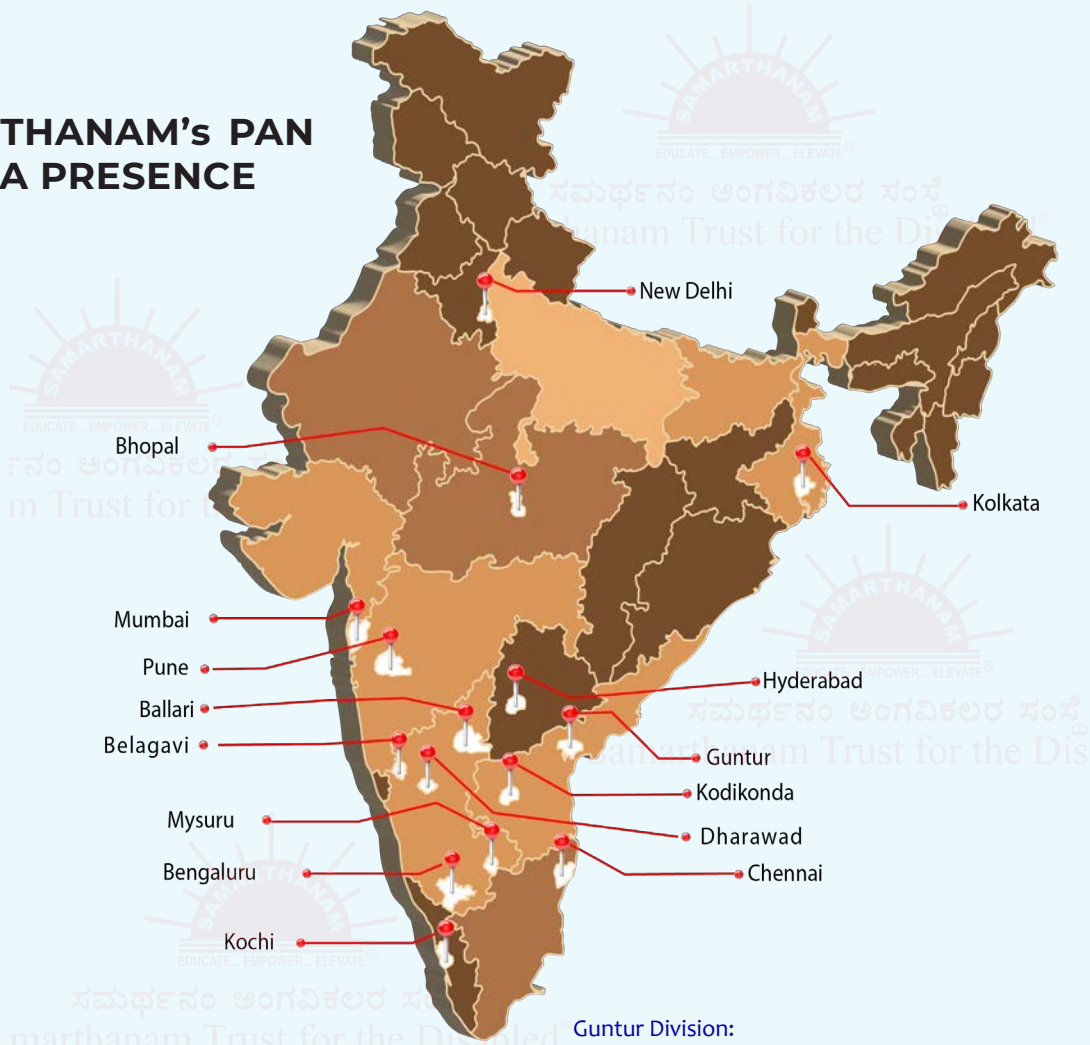
